On June 13, 2019, the Connecticut State Board of Education ("CSBE") accepted a report concerning the racial imbalance statistics for all schools in the state. This report indicates that McKinley School continues to be racially imbalanced. At the September 2017 meeting of the CSBE, the Fairfield Board of Education ("Fairfield Board") presented its amendment to the plan to address the racial imbalance at the school, and the CSBE granted conditional approval of the amended plan. In August of 2018, you provided an update on the Fairfield Board's progress in implementing this plan, and at that time, the plan was progressing as intended.
