Subject: Tobacco Survey Questions from BOE

In regards to the CDC survey – questions from the BOE:

1. How long will the survey take to complete?

The CDC estimates 25 minutes – 5 minutes for the survey administer to read the instructions and approximately 20 minutes for the students to complete the survey.

2. What is the amount of the monetary award?

\$500 After the students complete the survey, the school will receive a check within 4 – 6 weeks. Ideally, the CDC would like the school to purchase resource materials to support educating the students on the survey topics, however, that is not a condition of receiving the monetary award. The school can decide how they want to use the money.


