Minutes

- Meeting called to order 4:59 PM
 - Present were Jennifer Maxon-Kennelly, Jennifer Jacobson, Jeff Peterson, Mike Cummings, Colleen Deasy, Kristen Tozzo
- October 1, 2019 minutes approved 3-0 with changes
- Policy
 - Relocation Notice (Accessibility for Disabled)
 - Changes approved and voted out to full Board 3-0
 - Parent Organizations and Booster Clubs
 - Mike Cummings suggested the Athletic Directors provide an outline as to what they are spending every year and what their uniform replacement/equipment replacement schedule (waterfall chart), with the expectation that they will be as detailed as possible. This report should also include facilities/field issues that the District should monitor. There needs to be more transparency/accountability for each of the Athletic Departments.
 - The Board can decide if this is a presentation made annually with this information after the end of the school year, around August 15th or if it's an internal review.
 - This would help to put actual numbers to the perceptions of what is being spent at the two high schools and strengthen collaboration between them.
 - Colleen Deasy will look to see if CABA has a sample of Athletic Reporting and reporting from neighboring towns as samples. She will also work with Arlene Gottesman to create a template for the Athletic Directors.
 - The Policy Committee could create a paragraph for Policy that sets the Athletic Reporting up as a Regulation, which would tie into a report on Booster Club support. The Regulation would encompass finance/inventory, team membership, training for coaches, impact on the student athletes, and impact on transportation.
 - Colleen shared the draft of the Google doc survey that will go out to the ADs to share with coaches/gather information from each team.
 - The committee made a few suggestions as to categories they'd like added onto the survey.
 - This survey will not request actual dollar amounts but would serve as

information on each team's practice/process.

- Colleen will send out a revised survey with all changes made to the committee for approval before going out to the AD.
- The committee reviewed sample policies from CAFE, Shipman & Goodwin, and other districts. CAFE's rationale as to "why" a Booster Club policy should exist was met with agreement.
- Next steps toward creating FPS' own Policy will come after the Athletic Reports and surveys have been returned.
