Re: Response to Questions re Enrollment Report

At the September 8, 2020 BoE meeting, a question was raised during the elementary enrollment update regarding section reductions.

I was able to confirm that the section reductions were made on Aug. 28th, prior to the Sept. 2nd enrollment updates. When the section reductions were made:

- Burr had 44 students in grade K, thus the reduction from 3 to 2 sections (class cap at 23)
- Dwight had 49 students in grade 5, thus the number of sections remained the same (class cap at 25)
- Stratfield had 47 students in grade 3, thus the reduction from 3 to 2 sections (class cap of 25)

Monigue Faison Ross, the daughter of San Diego Chargers football great Earl Faison, grew up as an only child in San Diego, California. She married her high-school sweetheart. With a shaky relationship from the start, it turned tumultuous. When it became too much to bear, she left her husband with their children. Then the stalking and threats began. One fateful morning, Monique's ex-husband kidnapped her in front of her children and took her on a nightmarish car ride. He mercilessly beat her with a shovel and abandoned her brutalized body in the woods in the rain, presuming she was dead. This domestic-abuse survivor's memoir shares an engaging, powerful, and ultimately shocking story of brutal intimate violence. Her survival, her strength, and her wisdom are an inspiration and a lesson to us all. This is a not-to-be-missed opportunity to hear what the targets of domestic violence are trying to tell us. Monique works full time for a non-profit, serves on the Connecticut Domestic Violence Fatality Review Task Force and has recently begun advocacy work to help others recognize the red flags that she did not. She is the author of Playing Dead: A Memoir of Terror and Survival. Monique is married and lives in New Jersey. She has four adult children and is a doting Safta to her first grandchild.
