






SAT Achievement: ELA & Math






Smarter Balanced ELA Achievement by Elementary School (All Students Combined)





Smarter Balanced ELA Achievement by Middle School (All Students Combined)




SAT Achievement: ELA by School






Smarter Balanced Math Achievement by Elementary School (All Students Combined)



SAT Achievement Math by School






ELA Achievement by Grade





Math Achievement by Grade


NGSS - Science Achievement by Grade











SBA ELA Achievement by Ethnicity (All Students 3-8)




SBA Math Achievement by Ethnicity (All Students 3-8)




SAT EBRW Achievement - by Ethnicity






ATTENDANCE ENROLLMENT



Percent of Student Chronically Abset by Elementary School




Percent of Student Chronically Absent by Middle School






