The following student international travel trips for our secondary schools have been approved by the administration. In an effort to maintain consistent instructional practices, no staff or students will miss more than two (2) full days of school for any field trip.

At its October 26, 2004 meeting the Board of Education lifted the ban on foreign travel and delegated the approval for such trips to the Superintendent of Schools.

For your information the first day of Passover is April 4, 2015 with the last day of Passover being April 11, 2015. Good Friday will occur on April 3, 2015. Spring recess for staff and students begins on April 13, 2015 and ends on April 17, 2015.

FAIRFIELD LUDLOWE HIGH SCHOOL

Destination: Paris, France, London, England

Date of Trip: April 9-16, 2015

Cost of Trip: \$3,104.00 (per person)

Number of Students Attending: Approximately 12-24

Number of Chaperones: 6-7

On this trip students will learn about the absolutism of Louis XIV, the French Revolution, the Romantic Era, the Revolutions of 1848, the Western Front in WWI (100th Anniversary of the start of the war is in 2014), the Renaissance, and the development of British Democracy.

On this trip students will learn about the culture, language and history of France to practice speaking French with host families and students, to practice writing French through specific assignments completed by students during the trip. To share, in French, with the French students, teachers, and administrators facts about Fairfield Warde High School, and the American culture through 1st day presentation to the school on the part of Fairfield Warde High School students participating in the exchange program trip.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE BOARD 8100

- B. The Fairfield Board of Education shall have the following functions:
 - Building public support and understanding of public education. This means
 communicating and interpreting the school district's mission to the public, listening to
 the community, and when appropriate, incorporating citizens' views into the
 discussions and actions of the Board.
 - · Implementing state and federal legislation on the local level.
 - Developing trust with municipal officials is increasingly important.
 - Developing, implementing and monitoring the district's policies, including short and long-term goals. These policies serve as the road map for the school district. They give direction to the administration and staff and become the foundation for accountability.
 - Selecting, retaining and evaluating the Superintendent of Schools, who serves as the district's Chief Executive Officer and implements Board policy. Perhaps no single decision a Board makes has more impact than the selection of the Superintendent.
 - Developing, in collaboration with the Superintendent, approving and monitoring implementation of the budget. The budget provides resources for the educational priorities of the school district.
 - Serving as the impartial hearing panel on such issues as termination and grievance.

Amended Proposal B 8450 - Short Term Goals, Objectives and Action Plans

- a. The Board of Education shall formulate and approve, no later than the first meeting in June, specific Short Term Goals and Objectives which define the District's priorities for the following academic school year, with related Action Plans formulated in collaboration with the Superintendent by the start of the academic school year.
- b. The Board of Education Short Term BOE Goals, Objectives and Action Plans shall be in alignment with the BOE mission statement, long term educational goals ("Long Term Goals"), as well as the school district's 5 year Strategic Plan.
- c. Board of Education annual Short Term Goals and Objectives shall address a) Student Achievement, b) Fiscal Management, c) Board of Education Effectiveness, d) Human Resources e) Facilities and f) Other Special Objectives.
- d. These BOE Goals, Objectives and Action Plans shall strive to be specific, measurable, achievable, relevant and define a specific time frame.
- e. The Board of Ed shall in collaboration with the Superintendent review progress towards achieving the stated short term goals and objectives in each December, March, and June, respectively
- f. The Board of Education shall review every December, March and June, respectively, reports by District and individual school, to include measurable results related to School Climate and student achievement in the subjects of Math, Language Arts (Reading, Writing & Grammar) and Science.

Amended Proposal B, 8460 - Strategic Plan:

"In November of each year, the Board of Education shall review the District's Five Year Strategic Plan. The Board, in cooperation with the Superintendent, will publically assess the progress of the existing plan, discuss intended outcomes, and recommend adjustments to the Superintendent, that shall be required due to changes from year to year to include, but not be limited to, student or employee demographics, legislative and regulatory climate or educational requirements."
